In the early hours of the morning of November 2nd, 1958, at 2:00am **Richard Alan Allcorn** was born to the proud parents of Joe and Shirley Allcorn, in Coleman County, in the small town of Coleman Texas. The local hospital records his birth at 2:00am central time. Born with what is called a “prophet’s veil” on his face, Rich was fore ordained by God in his calling to serve mankind as a servant of the Most High, a prophet, and a spokesman for the Kingdom of Heaven.

Rich was saved at the age of 8 years old, and was baptized the following year in Ballinger Texas, at the First Baptist Church of Ballinger. At the age of 12 he was asked to teach the Adult Sunday School Department their Sunday school lesson, and was often asked for return visits afterwards. At thirteen, Rich was baptized in the Holy Ghost, in a small West Texas community, on their way back from Abilene, Texas. His life would never be the same afterwards.

Rich enlisted in the United States Air Force at the age of 18, and after basic training in San Antonio, Texas, and technical training in Biloxi, Mississippi, he was assigned to Bergstrom Air Force Base in Austin Texas. He began attending the Hillcrest Baptist Church there in Austin, where he met Mike Brown. At the time, Mike was an upcoming teacher of the Word and was teaching the youth departments about faith, following the teachings of Kenneth Copeland, and Kenneth Hagin, to name a few. Mike later became a full-time minister, and obtained his doctorate degree in Biblical and Theological Studies.

Re-assigned to George Air Force Base just 2 years later, Rich took these teaching with him and upon arrival in Victorville, California, he immediately applied for 1 week of leave (vacation) to attend his first Believer’s Convention in Long Beach, California. After receiving a personal prophecy from Kenneth Copeland during the meeting, Rich’s life spiraled upward in the study of the Word and in preaching.

Today, he has served in various areas of the church, to gain more experience in the different facets of ministry, and has served as a Sunday school teacher, Men’s Pastor, Singer in the praise and worship team, Praise and Worship Leader, Sound Department Director, Associate Pastor, and Sr. Pastor in various ministries. He met his wife, Jane, in March of 1996 and they were later married that same year on Sunday, July 7th, 1996.



Rich and Jane went on to train in the church, and moved their membership to Windy Hill Christian Center, where his former acquaintance, Pastor Mike Brown, was pastor. While there, they served and trained in various areas of ministry, and both obtained their ministers license, and earned their Bachelor’s Degrees in Biblical and Theological Studies. They were later ordained through House of Power Outreach, and then through Spirit of Truth Ministries.

After leaving Windy Hill Christian Center, Rich and Jane worked with Corey Ross in starting the Williamson County Cowboy Church. They served there as Associate Pastors, and Rich sang in the band, for over a year. In April of 2006, Rich and Jane decided to leave their Associate Pastor positions with the Williamson County Cowboy Church (Liberty Hill, Texas), and with the blessings of their pastor, Corey Ross, they endeavored to start a church of their own – WORD CHURCH.



After some moves in places to meet, it became clear to Rich that he need to better prepare with a “core group” of believers before he attempted to start such a large undertaking. They continue to serve under Rich Allcorn Ministries, and retain the name of Word Church, for use through the ministry Spirit of Truth Ministries, for world outreach, teaching, and travels, and for pasturing those in the field ministry who do not have pastors to help them in support of their ministries.

First, and foremost, Rich is a cowboy. He grew up ranching on a 675 acre ranch out in the Central-West Texas area between San Angelo and Abilene Texas, in Ballinger. The ranch itself is located in the Talpa and Crews areas, just 15 miles from Ballinger. Rich misses the ranch, and ranch life, and to this day, he and Corey Ross (the Williamson County Cowboy Church), keep in close touch and are affiliate partners with one another’s ministries. “He’s like a brother to me.”, Rich says. He’s very protective of this brother in the Lord, and the ministry they both believe in.

There is one thing that has always bothered Rich. After holding a cowboy church meeting, or an evangelistic meeting, he found that he wanted to be able to have something that he could offer leave folks with to help them grow in their walk with the Lord. He also wanted to help folks who were in deep financial need, as an answer to their problems. For the first, he began writing a “New Believer’s Handbook” that could be shared throughout ministries worldwide, as a springboard to help new Believer’s to grow and become strong in the Lord. For the second, he found that a monetary gift of some kind is more of a Band-Aid fix to a growing problem. It doesn’t “fix” their situation, only puts it off a bit. He wanted to be able to help these folks with something that they could use to “work” and bring themselves up and out of debt, and into financial freedom! Little did he know the answer was just around the corner!

In the early months of 2009, Rich was introduced to Fortune Hi-Tech Marketing (FHTM), by his niece, Samantha, and the answer to his prayers now sat before him! Fortune Hi-Tech Marketing, or FHTM, was founded by Roy Orberson with the sole intent of helping the members of this organization to make money! He wanted folks to be able to have a mechanism to allow them to achieve financial freedom, and not take 20 years to do it! With FHTM, finally Rich had the tool, the mechanism, to help folks to get started into a business venture that could be worked, on-the-side, while they continued their regular jobs, and would provide them a means to work themselves right out of debt, and into financial freedom!

Today, Rich is writing his books, and building his business with FHTM, to make it possible for him to travel the world and teach folks the Word of God.

With invitations to come and teach and preach in many areas of Africa, India, the Philippines, and many other foreign countries, as well as in the U.S., Rich sees a need to be able to finance these travels and the ministry to carry out these callings. He hopes to be able to do this through the royalties obtained from the books he writes, and from his business ventures with FHTM and the financial freedom that it offers, and from supporters and partners who believe in the calling God has placed upon his life!

Rich is all about teaching the “cowboy way” ... a life of honor, integrity, and character. He’s the real deal. Some of America’s best heroes were cowboys. “We’ve just gotten too busy now to pay attention. But that stuff still matters”, says Rich. “Core values are vital to the integrity and character of man!” he preaches. And he’s big on “the blood covenant” too! He doesn’t just “believe”, but he “knows” that he has a covenant with God! He’s had God heal his vision, and totally and completely restore his heart (from a heart attack), and he “knows” that God wants His kids to be prosperous! Rich understands covenant, and the beliefs of a covenant relationship run deep where he’s concerned.

He’ll be the first to tell you about “the real deal” ... a covenant with God that will change your life, forever! And if you’re lucky, he’ll tell you about FHTM too, but not before he’s made sure that you’ve met his Jesus! He sees it this way ... “If ya’ don’t know Jesus, then all in the world that money is going to do, is to ruin ya’!” Money is not the answer to a man’s problems. With Jesus, though, even a man’s money problems can be worked out. And his body can be healed, his marriage restored, and all that he has can begin to prosper right there before him!
